Public Comment:

Lynn Smith

- 1. Suggested the acquisition of tree saplings from the Arbor Day Foundation.
- 2. Inquired as to why a meeting with the EAC, borough staff, and Hatboro Public Works never occurred and asked if it still can.
- 3. Asked why borough continues to mow grass along the riparian buffer and in the creek itself and if there is a guidance document to make changes to this procedure.

Katrina Nuss

- 1. Mugwort growing in parking loop in front of Borough Hall should be removed before it spreads to Miller Meadow.
- 2. EAC website lacks 2020 minutes recorded by Carol Brunner.
- 3. EAC website should have all annual reports easily locatable.
- 4. Key EAC topics should be on agenda to prevent loss of continuity. These include ordinances such as the RCCD and the native plant ordinance.
- 5. New riparian buffer installations at PERT are not mowed, allowing additional plant growth in these areas and protecting trees from mowing damage. Hatboro should stop mowing around trees and along stream banks.

Todd A'Harrah asked what the pushback for CCA included. Tim Schultz will share the email enumerating the patchwork and timing issues of concern to the PUC.
